SERIES NOTES: The Aggies and the Wildcats will meet for the 33rd time. Today, will mark the eighth time the Aggies and the Wildcats have met on the Aggies homecoming. The Aggies are 4-3 when the Wildcats are the invited guest for homecoming. A&T's and B-CU's last homecoming matchup at Aggie Stadium came in 2007 when the Wildcats defeated the Aggies 24-20. B-CU has been successful against the Aggies in Greensboro. The Aggies last win over the Wildcats at Aggie Stadium came in 2000, a 30-19 decision. The last win over B-CU came in 2003.

Homecoming ups and downs

This will be 29th North Carolina A&T homecoming conducted at Aggie Stadium. Over the first 28 homecomings at the East Lindsay Street stadium, the Aggies have lost 14 and won 14. The .500 record is a result of the Aggies losing their last five homecoming affairs. The Aggies will face Bethune-Cookman for eighth time at Aggie Stadium when homecoming is involved. The Wildcats appearance this season will match Howard for the most frequent Aggies homecoming opponent.

The Scouting Report

The homecoming game might last about an hour considering how much the Aggies like to run the ball along with Bethune-Cookman's desire to stay on the ground. Four different players have more than 100 yards rushing this season for the Wildcats, and they are just three yards away from having four men over 200 yards rushing. Fred McCaskill, Maurice Francois, Androse Bell and Matthew Johnson have all played key roles in the Wildcats running attack. Francois has also thrown for 229 yards and his partner at the quarterback position – Matthew Johnson – has thrown for 462 yards and a touchdown. The favorite target has been JeVaughn Reams who has 27 receptions for 369 yards. Defensively, Reggie Sandilands leads the Wildcats in tackles with 46.

Inside the Numbers...

- 1** – In 12 seasons as a defensive coordinator at three different MEAC schools, Alonzo Lee's defenses have finished No. 1 in the conference five times.
- 1** -- The number of wins the Aggies need to secure their first winning season in six years.
- 3** -- Is the number of times the Aggies have lost a fumble this season. That is not bad when you consider they have carried the ball 281 times.
- 4** -- The number of homecoming victories the Aggies have over Bethune-Cookman at Aggie Stadium.
- 5** – The Aggies received five preseason honors. Senior Jarrell Herring earned preseason All-American honors from Consensus Draft Services. CDS also named senior linebacker Andre Thornton and junior offensive lineman Enoch Cohen preseason All-HBCU. Thornton and senior defensive end Tyre Glasper earned preseason second-team all-MEAC honors.
- 5** – Is the number of interceptions defensive back Justin Ferrell has this season to lead the conference.
- 6** – It has been six seasons since the Aggies have had the No. 1 defense in the conference. The defensive coordinator of that team was Alonzo Lee.
- 7** – Seven of Lee's 12 last defenses finished among in the top 40 defenses in the nation.
- 9** -- The Aggies are on the plus side of this number. The Aggies plus-9 turnover margin is second best in the conference and ninth best in the nation.
- 11 1/2** -- It is the number of times Tyre Glasper has made a tackle behind the line of scrimmage this season. He is a half tackle behind Hampton's Kendrick Ellis for the conference lead.
- 14** – Is the number of tackles senior Andre Thornton needs to move into the Aggies top-10 list all-time. Thornton comes into the season with 234 career tackles.
- 20** -- The number of interceptions the Aggies have had the last three seasons. The Aggies have 10 picks so far this season.

Wildcat/Aggie connections

There are not many North Carolina A&T/Bethune-Cookman connections that are apparent because the Wildcats roster consists of 73 players who are from the state of Florida. The Wildcats do have two players from the state of North Carolina on their roster in wide receiver Kevin Howell (Raleigh) and offensive lineman Marquell Rozier (St. Paul's). The Aggies have a couple of players from Tallahassee, Fla., in freshman RB Dontavious Payne and freshman DB D'Vonte Graham. B-CU freshman DB C.J. Wilson attended Godby in Tallahassee.

A Glance at the Aggies 2009 Opponents

Including Delaware State, who will forfeit a game to the Aggies this season, N.C. A&T's 11 2009 opponents were 63H-64 last season. The good news for the Aggies is their first seven opponents were 30-49 last season. The bad news is, the final three opponents the Aggies will face were 27-9 in 2008, including defending MEAC Champion S.C. State. There is no difference in the Aggies schedule other than not playing Johnson C. Smith this season. Four of the Aggies opponents – Hampton, Bethune-Cookman, Florida A&M and S.C. State – had winning records last season. Two of the Aggies opponents – Coastal Carolina and Morgan State – had .500 records. Meanwhile, five of the opponents had losing records.

Saturday's Captains vs. Howard

The four men who walked out as captains for the Aggies on Saturday were wide receiver Giorgio Lowrance, senior quarterback Carlton Fears, senior defensive end Tyre Glasper and senior defensive lineman Adam Beal. All four players are seniors with two of the players – Beal and Glasper – being fifth-year seniors. Fears, a junior college transfer, was the only player who has been at N.C. A&T less than two years. Despite the Aggies having 51 players from North Carolina, Lowrance was the only captain on Saturday from North Carolina. Fears is from Georgia and Beal and Glasper are from Detroit.

Recap the Howard Game

...North Carolina A&T scored 30 points against the Bison. It is the most points the Aggies have scored since scoring 44 points against Johnson C. Smith. It is also the most points the Aggies have scored against a Division I FCS opponent since 2005 when they scored 40 points against Morgan State in overtime. It is the most points scored in regulation against a Division I FCS opponent since the Aggies scored 38 points versus Hampton in 2003.

...North Carolina A&T running back Dontavious Payne became the first freshman to rush for more than 100 yards since Barry Turner did it against Delaware State on Nov. 3, 1991.

...For the second time this season, sophomore safety Justin Ferrell intercepted two passes in a game. This hasn't been accomplished since Curtis Burgins did it back in 1994. Burgins went on to intercept eight passes that season to break the school record.

...The Aggies held an opponent to under 100 yards rushing for the third time this season. Howard managed just 87 yards on the ground against the Aggies. The other two subpar 100-yard performances by teams came from Winston-Salem State and N.C. Central. The Aggies have been victorious in all three games. The Aggies are giving up just 131.1 yards per game during the 2009 season.

The "Wyatt-bone"

Bethune-Cookman head coach Alvin Wyatt will bring to Greensboro his "Wyatt-bone" offense. It is essentially an option offense that heavily relies on the quarterback reading what the defense is giving him. The Wildcats will run a combination of dive, quarterback keepers and option with their running backs. The Aggies haven't fared well lately against the rush-oriented offense of the Wildcats. They have won the last five against the Aggies.

Defensive improvements

North Carolina A&T has made dramatic improvements on the defensive side of the ball. The Aggies rank in the top 25 in five different defensive categories nationally. Rookie of the Week

The combination of freshman Dontavious Payne and first-year sophomore Mike Mayhew are sharing everything. The two share carries, they now share starts and they have something else in common. Both men have been named MEAC Rookie of the Week this season. The latest honor goes to Payne after he rushed for 113 yards and two touchdowns on 21 carries. Payne is a Tallahassee, Fla., native. Payne has rushed for 304 yards and two touchdowns this season on 87 carries. He ranks eighth in the MEAC rushing, and he is the first Aggie freshman to rush for 100 yards in 18 years.

What the forfeit means for the A&T

North Carolina A&T did indeed receive an overall and conference win last week when Delaware State forfeited the game to complete an obligation it had with the Big 10's Michigan Wolverines. But the NCAA does not recognize forfeits as wins, therefore a win will not be recorded in any record keeping procedures concerning N.C. A&T through the NCAA. This means the NCAA will not record a career-record win for head coach Alonzo Lee. It considered a "No Contest" in the eyes of the NCAA. The MEAC does recognize the win mainly for the sake of the conference race. The Aggies now has more conference wins than they have had in the last four years combined.

Running Back by committee

The Aggies have been using every resource they have to run the football this season. Not only have running backs Tony Coles, Mike Mayhew and Dontavious Payne seen a lot of action this season, but quarterback Carlton Fears and receiver Larry Raper also see carries in the Aggies offense. The multiple runners have kept the Aggies backfield healthy this season, and it has resulted in the Aggies having the fifth-best rushing attack in the MEAC this season. Mike Mayhew and Dontavious Payne are rank sixth and eighth respectively in the MEAC. The rookie duo has rushed for a combined 707 yards, seven touchdowns on 167 carries. Over the next three games, the combo is on pace to rush for more than 1,000 yards and 10 touchdowns. Fears has also become an important part of the Aggies rushing attack. Fears has carried the ball 73 times and Coles has 15 carries. Here is how the carry distribution breaks down.

A Year Ago Against the Wildcats

The Wildcats look a lot different than the team that beat the Aggies 24-14 in Daytona Beach last season. Wildcats running back Brian Sumlar played a key role in the game. Sumlar rushed for 97 yards on 22 carries last season. A year ago, Wildcats quarterback Matthew Johnson threw a total of three passes. This season, he is the Wildcats leading passer and he also has 197 yards rushing and a touchdown on 68 carries. The Aggies are also slightly different. No one who carried the ball for the Aggies last season will carry it for them this season against the Wildcats. Wallace Miles is the only receiver on this year's team that caught a pass in last year's game. Defensively, linebacker Josh Smiley recorded 10 tackles for the Wildcats. Ryan Lewis made had only one pass breakup in last season's game, but this season he is the Wildcats' second-leading tackler. Dexter Jackson made four stops last season. He is third on the team in tackles this season. Jamison Hedgepeth and Jarrell Herring had 12 and 10 tackles apiece for the Aggies in 2009.

An Aggies Win Means

...The Aggies will guarantee their first winning season in six years. The Aggies have had just two winning seasons in the last seven years. ...The Aggies will double their win total from the last three seasons combined. The Aggies have won just three games in the last three years. This season they have a chance to win their sixth win of the season. A win today will also give the Aggies their fourth conference win of the season. It quadruples their conference win total from the last three seasons combined.

...The Aggies will win their first homecoming in five years and thusly give the Aggie seniors their first career homecoming win. It will also improve the Aggies to 4-1 at home. It will be the Aggies best home record in six years, and it will give the Aggies seven home wins in the last two seasons.

The battle for turnovers

There will be contrast of styles today when the Aggies take on the Wildcats. The Aggies have forced 18 turnovers this season, while turning the ball over just nine times over their first seven games played. Meanwhile, the Wildcats have turned the ball over 26 times, while forcing 12 turnovers. The Aggies plus-9 turnover margin and the Wildcats' minus-14 turnover margin rank the teams second and ninth respectively.

The Mad Tackler

Andre Thornton is slowly moving up the all-time tackles list for N.C. A&T. He has 246 career tackles, 19.5 tackles for loss and 10 pass deflections for his career. Thornton has 25 tackles this season. He had a season-high seven tackles against Norfolk State and Hampton. Thornton has averaged 73.7 tackles per season since being an Aggie. At that pace, he will come close to finishing with 300 career tackles, which would put him in the top 7 all-time. He needs just 15 tackles to move into the top 10 all-time on the list.

First-time success

Alonzo Lee has a chance to do something only five other coaches have done in their first year as North Carolina A&T's head football coach – finish with a winning record. The last coach to have his debut season at N.C. A&T end with a winning record was George Small in 2003. A win over Bethune-Cookman would solidify Lee's place in N.C. A&T history. Three more wins and Lee could finish with the second most wins of any debut coach.

Third Down Defense

The Aggies have been remarkable defensively on third down. The Aggies are good at getting offenses off the field by stopping them on third down. So is their opponent this week. The Aggies and the Wildcats rank in the top 10 in getting teams off the field on third down. The Aggies rank fourth in the nation in 3rd down defense efficiency, while the Wildcats lead the nation. Opponents have converted just 24 percent of their 3rd downs against the Aggies this season. Meanwhile, the Wildcat opponents have converted just 16.5 percent of their third downs against B-CU. The Aggies are on pace to have the best defensive showing in terms of preventing third down conversion since the 1995 team limited teams to just a 24 percent (33 of 135) third down conversion rate.

The Roster Breakdown

The Aggies are hoping for success this season, but they definitely built for the future. The Aggies roster consists of 31 true freshmen and six redshirt freshmen. There are also 21 sophomores on the roster to go along with 16 juniors and 14 seniors. The N.C. A&T football team is represented by 14 states and Washington, D.C. By far North Carolina is represented the most with 51 players from the Old North State. The state of Florida is represented well with eight players on the roster. The Aggies roster also has six players from Georgia and three players apiece are from California, Michigan and Maryland. The other states represented include Louisiana, New York, South Carolina, Kentucky, Alabama, New Jersey and Tennessee.

Cracking the Top 10

The Aggies once again came close, but could not crack the top 10 in the latest SBN poll that determines the Black College National Champion. The Aggies have not entered the SBN poll in four seasons. The Aggies garnered 29 votes this week, eight behind No. 10 Shaw of the CIAA. A win over the Wildcats this weekend could enter the Aggies into the poll. The Aggies last appearance came in 2004 when the Aggies were coming off of their 2003 MEAC Championship season.

Making All The Starts

North Carolina A&T senior quarterback Carlton Fears has started all seven games the Aggies have played this season. If he is able to start the remaining three games for the Aggies, he will become the first Aggie to start every game at quarterback since Maseo Bolin did it in 1995. Bolin was a senior when he made those 11 starts in '95. Fears has led the Aggies to a 5-3 record. Bolin and the Aggies of 1995 went 4-7. Fears has played most of the snaps this season with Lewis Kindle getting snaps against Hampton and Coastal Carolina.

Streak buster?

Senior defensive back Nick Clement is listed as probable for the Aggies game against Bethune-Cookman. He had a questionable status early last week after fracturing his finger. Clement's injury put his consecutive games played streak on the line. His impressive streak continued thanks to a cast that was molded to fit his hand in order to protect his finger. Clement has been as durable as any Aggie over the past four seasons with 41 consecutive games played. If he would not have been able to perform, the longest streak on the team will belong to Jamison Hedgepeth.

Roomate Connection

North Carolina A&T leading receiver Wallace Miles and starting quarterback Carlton Fears are roommates off the field and they seem to have a connection on the field. During Fears' career, he has completed 104 passes. Thirty-four of those passes have gone to Miles. Four of the passes to Miles has resulted in touchdowns. This means that 32.7 percent of Fears' career completions have gone to Miles. Miles is on pace to lead the Aggies in receiving for a second consecutive season.

Senior Redemption

The 12 North Carolina A&T seniors have had a rough three years and for the Aggies nine four and five-year seniors, it has been even tougher. Over their first two years, they went a disappointing 0-22. But this season has seen them come into this week's game against Howard with a 4-3 record and they have a shot at the school's first winning season since 2003. The Aggies nine four and five-year seniors are linebackers Jamison Hedgepeth, Andre Thornton, defensive end Tyre Glasper, defensive tackle Adam Beal, safety Nick Clement, receivers Giorgio Lowrance, Cedric Byrd, safety Vernon White and offensive lineman Nate Anderson.

Senior quarterback Carlton Fears threw for 131 yards on 17-for-31 passing, and he added 78 yards rushing and a touchdown to lead the Aggies to a 19-10 win over the Rams at Bowman Gray Stadium.

It was the first career win for Aggies head coach Alonzo Lee. He becomes just the fifth Aggies head coach to win his debut.

The Aggies offense compiled 285 yards of offense, which is a moral victory for an offense that struggled mightily last season.

A bad snap over the head of Rams punter Landen Thayer, gave the Aggies the ball at the Rams 10 with 9:23 remaining in the game. Three plays later, with two missed field goals already on Patrick Courtney's stat sheet, Lee turned to his young kicker. Courtney responded by booming a 25-yard field through the upright for a 13-10 Aggies lead.

Another young player – defensive lineman Brandon Young – came up with the play that put the Aggies in position to clinch the victory. The Aggies flushed Rams quarterback Branden Williams out of the pocket.

In his haste to get away from Aggie defenders, Williams dropped the football and had it recovered by Young at the Rams 18. Fears collected 17 yards on the drive, and sophomore running back Mike Mayhew finished off the drive with a 1-yard touchdown with 1:55 to go.

The Aggies defense held the Rams to just 90 yards of offense and forced two turnovers.

 North Carolina A&T didn't allow a point over the final 44 minutes of the game to earn a 17-13 win at Aggie Stadium. The win gives the Aggies their first 1-0 start in the MEAC in four years. Their last 1-0 start came at the expense of NSU.

The Aggies overcame a slow start and a 13-3 deficit to take a 17-13 lead to open the second half. Sophomore running back Mike Mayhew carried the ball on all five plays of the Aggies 61-yard scoring drive that was aided by a five-yard Norfolk State penalty.

Although Mayhew's score ended up being the game-winning touchdown, the Spartans were not above seriously threatening to take the lead in the fourth quarter.

A 29-yard run by DeAngelo Branch and a 9-yard run by quarterback Dennis Brown gave the Spartans the ball at the Aggie 6 with just over 11 minutes to play. Three plays later, the Spartans faced a 4th-and-goal from the 1. Brown tried to take the lead with a quarterback sneak, but the Aggies defense led by middle linebacker Brandon Jackson stopped Brown's progress before he could cross the goal line.

Lee said he wanted to pinch his interior defensive lineman, while having two guys coming off the edge to guard against NSU using the agile Brown on a quarterback rollout.

The Spartans had one last drive to mount. NSU gave the Aggies cause for concern when Brown completed 10-yard out to Chris Bell on a 4th-and-8 from the Aggies 42. But the Aggies defense stiffened from there, allowing the Spartans just one yard over the next four plays. With no timeouts remaining for the Spartans, the game essentially ended when Aggies defensive end Tyre Glasper forced Brown to rush his throw to Jeremy Wicker for an incomplete pass.

GREENSBORO – The North Carolina A&T football team’s 2-0 start had a lot to do with the Aggies not turning the ball over, running the ball effectively and not surrendering big plays.

Those three components were missing Saturday night as

Hampton defeated the Aggies 24-14 on an ESPNU telecast from Aggie Stadium. The Aggies dropped to 0-6 on ESPN telecast. Senior Jarrell Herring led the Aggies with 12 tackles.

None of the 129 plays the Aggies (2-1, 1-1 MEAC) ran over the first two games were complemented with a turnover. The Aggies reversed that trend on Saturday with three turnovers. The third turnover was an interception thrown by freshman quarterback Lewis Kindle that led to a Brandon Roundtree 5-yard interception return for a touchdown.

Roundtree’s return gave the Pirates a 24-7 lead with 12:27 remaining in the game. Kindle spelled senior starter Carlton Fears in the fourth quarter after Fears threw for 110 yards, a touchdown and an interception on 8-for-16 passing. The drive in which Kindle threw the interception was his first time seeing action this season.

Lee said the two had competed in practice all week for the starting job against the Pirates. The two will do the same in the days leading up to the game against Coastal Carolina on Sept. 26. Lee warned that people shouldn’t focus on an Aggies quarterback controversy. All of the Aggie starting positions are up for grabs each week, according to Lee.

The Aggies had success moving the ball early. Their first drive ended at the Hampton 27-yard line on a fumble, while their second possession stopped at the Hampton 24 on a turnover on downs. The Aggies had another excellent scoring opportunity to start the second half.

Hampton (2-1, 1-0) turned the ball over on its first possession of the third quarter as Tyre Glasper and Jamison Hedgepeth stripped the football from Hampton quarterback Herbert Bynes. Jamal Wardlaw recovered at the Pirates 31. But on the first play of the Aggies drive, Roundtree stepped in front of Fears’ pass to secure the first of his two interceptions on the day. The Aggies offense did slow down in the second half. Before N.C. A&T sophomore running Mike Mayhew closed out the scoring in the game with a 59-yard touchdown run with 3:41 remaining; the Aggies had just minus-13 yards rushing in the second half.

Whether it is five plays or one, the North Carolina A&T football team is going to find the group of plays or play it can run effectively.

Despite making some big plays on Saturday, the N.C. A&T offense never found the consistency it was looking for

in a 28-7 loss to Coastal Carolina at Brooks Stadium.

Sophomore running back Mike Mayhew led the Aggies with 84 yards rushing on 11 carries. But through the air, senior Aggie quarterback Carlton Fears threw for 99 yards on 7-for-22 passing and two interceptions. Freshman quarterback Lewis Kindle threw four passes. He completed one and had an interception.

Coastal Carolina had something to do with the Aggies woes. The Chanticleers sacked Fears four times. On the offensive end, Coastal rushed for 304 yards led by Eric O'Neal's 130 yards on 23 carries. Tommy Fraser chipped in with 98 yards and a touchdown on 16 carries. The Aggies defense did intercept two passes.

The first pick halted a threatening drive by Coastal in the first quarter as Quay Long intercepted a Zach MacDowall pass in the end zone. The second led to the Aggies only score of the game as MacDowall threw a pass out in the flats only to find senior linebacker Andre Thornton standing there for the interception at the Aggies 35-yard line.

The Aggies took over at their own 40 and quickly went deep to freshman receiver Larry Raper for a 51-yard gain to the Chanticleer 9. Raper wasn't done. On the next play, he took the hand-off on an end-around and scored a 9-yard touchdown to cut the Chanticleers lead to 14-7 midway through the third quarter. The Aggies defense kept the momentum going by holding the Chanticleers to a three-and-out series to give the offense the ball back.

Fears' 27-yard run on the Aggies ensuing drive advanced the ball to the Chanticleer 49 with 1:14 remaining in the third quarter. It was the last real offensive threat the Aggies made in the game. The next three plays after Fears' run went for no yardage, forcing an Aggies punt.

The Chanticleers took advantage. On a 3rd-and-3 from their own 45, MacDowall found Brandon Whitley for a short pass that Whitley turned into a 55-yard touchdown reception for a 21-7 Chanticleers lead. Coastal closed out the Aggies with a 39-yard touchdown run by Fraser.

Carlton Fears connected with sophomore receiver Wallace Miles for a 24-yard touchdown pass to give the Aggies a 23-17 double overtime win over the Eagles.

Fears threw for a career-high 166 yards and two touchdowns. The Eagles were led by senior receiver Will Scott who also had a career day with five catches for 179 yards and a touchdown.

The hotly contested game marked the fifth time in the last six matchups the Aggie-Eagle game was decided by a touchdown or less. It was also the third time in the last 12 contests the game ended in overtime.

As Miles leaped over the end zone, it secured the Aggies third straight overtime win. Their last extra period win came on Oct. 8, 2005 at FedEx Field against Morgan State. There was tons of drama before Miles' game-winning score. But the actual craziness started when NCCU quarterback Michael Johnson connected with Scott for a 20-yard gain to the Aggies 10-yard line with the Eagles trailing the Aggies 17-14 with 5:02 remaining in regulation.

Three weeks ago, the Aggies had a thrilling goal line stand against Norfolk State. They found themselves in the same stingy mood on Saturday. On 3rd-and-goal from the 18-foot line, Aggies safety Vernon White sliced through NCCU blockers to stop Tim Shankle for a 2-yard loss. Freshman kicker Frankie Cardelle tied the game with a 20-yard field goal with 2:36 remaining. It appeared the Eagles would get a chance to win the game in the closing minutes as the Aggies faced a 3rd-and-18 from their own 38 with a little more than a minute remaining. But senior receiver Giorgio Lowrance was able to go up high and bring down a 33-yard reception that kept the Aggies hopes of a last-second victory alive. Three plays later, a 5-yard Mike Mayhew run put the ball on the NCCU 20 with 11 seconds remaining. But freshman Patrick Courtney's 37-yard field goal came up short, sending the game into overtime.

In collegiate overtimes, the ball is placed at the opponent's 25, and each team is guaranteed at least one possession. The first possession of overtime went to the Aggies. An unsportsmanlike penalty on a 3rd-and-8 gave the Aggies a first down at the Eagles 14. But the Aggies gained only two yards in three plays, setting up a 29-yard field goal from Courtney. His kick went wide left, leaving the Eagles with a chance to win the game. On their first possession of overtime, a face mask penalty helped the Eagles move the ball to the Aggies 10 before brining on Cardelle who narrowly missed a 49-yard field goal earlier in the game. This kick would be much shorter – 27 yards – and it was for the game. The Aggies had an answer for Cardelle's foot. They didn't let the ball get anywhere near the upright.

Senior Jarrell Herring came charging through to block Cardelle's kick, forcing overtime. Herring's blocked kick marked the fourth time in five games the Aggies have either blocked a field goal or extra point.

The Eagles took first possession in the second overtime. An unsportsmanlike penalty on the Eagles was called after the blocked field goal. Therefore, NCCU had to start its drive on the Aggies 40. The Eagles moved the ball to the 35 and sent Cardelle back out to attempt a 52-yard field goal. Cardelle's kick went through the upright, but it didn't count because his team called timeout before he kicked it.

Rison had a change of heart after the inopportune timeout. The Eagles went for it on 4th-and-5, but this time Johnson's pass sailed past Scott to end the Eagles possession. Two plays later, Miles was in the end zone.

the North Carolina A&T defense forced that yielded only six points. Maybe the 103-yard kickoff return by Justin Ferrell that was called back for an illegal block is a good place to start.

There was also a blocked extra point in a game that ended with Morgan State earning a 7-6 win over the Aggies Saturday afternoon at Hughes Stadium. Whatever the Aggies point to for the loss, the certainty is that there were plenty of opportunities the Aggies didn't take advantage of.

Senior quarterback Carlton Fears threw for 133 yards and an interception on 18-for-34 passing. He also had 50 yards rushing. Sophomore Jeremy Graham led the Aggies with 10 tackles, which marked his first career double-figure tackling performance.

The Aggies final drive of the game might have summed things up the best. With Morgan State holding on to its one point lead, the Aggies took over at their own 35-yard line with three minutes remaining. Two pass completions to sophomore receiver Wallace Miles and a 10-yard pickup off of a screen pass to sophomore running back Mike Mayhew helped the Aggies move the ball into Morgan State territory for the ninth time in the game. On a 2nd-and-1 from the MSU 30, however, Fears was stopped for a 1-yard loss which forced the Aggies to call their final timeout with 1:05 to play. A three-yard run by Fears gave the Aggies a new set of downs. An incomplection and a 3-yard completion to Mayhew put the Aggies in a 3rd-and-7 situation from the MSU 25 as the clock ticked below 50 seconds remaining in the game. Fears took the snap from center, rolled to his right, tried to cut back and slipped on the Bears' synthetic surface for a 9-yard loss. Fears' fall and the Aggies lack of timeouts forced the Aggies to rush on the field for a last-second field goal by Miles. Miles' desperation kick had plenty of height but came up short.

The Aggies red zone deficiencies have bothered Lee all season long. Out of the 21 times the Aggies have been in the red zone this season, they have come away with six touchdowns. Out of the 14 possessions the Aggies obtained on Saturday, nine of them went into MSU territory.

On one of those possessions inside the Bears 50 came early in the fourth quarter. The Aggies took the ball to the MSU 15, but a holding penalty and a 15-yard loss by Fears who caught a deflected pass instead of knocking it down, moved the Aggies back to the Bears 40.

The Aggies defense was stellar all afternoon. Morgan State's best drive of the day also turned out to be the game-winning drive. The Bears went 80 yards in five plays and scored on a 7-yard touchdown run by Devan James with 24 seconds remaining in the first quarter. The Bears did not have a drive over 24 yards the rest of the way.

N.C. A&T did take advantage of one Bears turnover. With the Aggies trailing 7-0, a muffed punt return by the Bears gave the Aggies the ball at the Bears 11. Three plays later, Tony Coles scored on a 1-yard touchdown with 7:03 remaining in the third quarter. But the Bears blocked the extra point, which turned out to be the difference in the game.

WASHINGTON, D.C. –

Were there 50-yard touch-down passes or 15-play drives from the North Carolina A&T offense on Saturday? Not quite.

But who says that always constitutes offensive production. The Aggies did take advantage of the opportunities Howard pre-

sented, and it did result in the Aggies scoring a season-high 30 points in a 30-19 win over the Bison at Hughes Stadium. The Aggies won in the nation's capital for the first in 11 years, and they ruined the Bison's homecoming.

Two weeks ago, the Aggies offense scored on just one of its four opportunities inside Morgan State's 20-yard line. On Saturday, the Aggies were 4-for-4 inside the Bison's red zone. The N.C. A&T offense also produced its first 100-yard rusher of the season as freshman Dontavious Payne compiled 113 yards and two touchdowns on 21 carries.

Sophomore running back Mike Mayhew put the game away with a 45-yard touchdown run in the fourth quarter. As Saturday's game entered the second quarter, offensive output was not the only concern for N.C. A&T. With the game tied at 7, the Bison moved the ball effectively against a strong Aggies defense by putting together a 13-play, 68-yard drive that included a 15-yard run by Brandon Drayton and 15-yard reception by Drayton. Drayton's reception gave the Bison the ball at the Aggies 13.

The Aggies defense stiffened to hold the Bison to a 30-yard field goal by Dennis Wiehberg. After a 3-and-out by the Aggies, a 19-yard run by Andra Williams set up a 33-yard field goal to give the Bison a 13-7 lead with 1:24 remaining in the first half. The Aggies brand of football in 2009 is forcing teams into errors and turnovers. Payne opened the second half with a two-yard touch-down that was set up by his own 49-yard run to the Bison 21. After taking the lead for good on Payne's run, the Aggies took advantage of Howard's issues with its long snapper and punter.

Howard punter Patrick Wolff had a snap launched over his head, which gave the Aggies the ball at the Bison 14 with 8:07 remaining in the third quarter. It set up a milestone for the Aggies leading receiver Wallace Miles. After three plays resulted in minus-2 yards, Miles lined up as the Aggies field goal kicker and booted a 32-yarder for his first career make, and a 17-13 Aggies lead. Howard's punting issues continued into the fourth quarter. On a 4th-and-5 from the Bison 19, Wolff had the snap rolled to his feet. It led to the Aggies getting the ball at the Bison 5. A play later, Payne ran through the middle of the Bison's defense for a touchdown and a 24-13 lead.

With the Aggies offense taking advantage of Howard miscues, the Aggies defense began making sure the Aggies offense kept the ball. Aggies safety Justin Ferrell intercepted at Floyd Haigler pass at the Aggies 1 with 6:05 remaining in the game. The bad field position for the Aggies led to the Bison starting its next drive at the Aggies 32.

Three plays later, the Bison cut into the Aggies lead as Willie Carter broke an Aggies tackle on his way to a 30-yard touchdown reception from Haigler. The two-point conversion failed to keep the Aggies lead at five, 24-19. After Mayhew's score, Ferrell sealed the win for N.C. A&T with another interception at the Aggies 1. It was Ferrell's fifth interception of the season, putting him three INT's short of tying the single-season school record at eight.
